Notes: Several of our regular attendants at the service are today attending the University Baccalaureate service. By special vote last Sunday and as result of action taken at the business meeting last Wednesday, the church decided that our service should not be discontinued on this date.

At 8:00 this evening, at Gray Chapel, the Ohio Wesleyan Singers Club will present a concert program to which we are cordially invited.

Our Pastor Emeritus is preaching today at the First Baptist Church of Oberlin, Ohio, where he has been unanimously called to serve as acting pastor.

Such a plan gives our loyal people the chance to take trips after the morning church service, to encourage those who might not stay to church as usual in the cold weather, to stay for this briefer period, and moreover to eliminate that 15 minute period between the school and the church worship, when our time could be conserved to better advantage. Let the plan be discussed by everybody pro and con, and soon after Children's day, which is one week from today, we ought to be prepared to adopt a plan agreeable to practically everybody.

And don't forget our Wednesday evening service at 7:30. Twenty-two were present last week when Mrs. Barth and the Stewardship committee had charge of the program. You will enjoy the meeting this week. The theme: "Glaciers—Masses of 'Ice'". Come for a program that will make you forget the weather, if you do not like hot weather.







But contrast the Pilgrim whose first thought was of God and His worship. In 1650 Governor Bradford wrote of these pioneers: "Being thus arrived in a good harbor and brought safe to land, they fell upon their knees and blessed ye God of heaven, who had brought them over ye vast and furious ocean, and delivered them from all ye perils and miseries thereof, againe to set their feete on ye firme and stable earth, their proper elemente...." But here I cannot but stay and make a pause, and stand half amazed at this poore people's present condition.... They had now no friends to welcome them, nor inns to entertain or refresh their weatherbeaten bodies, no houses or much less townes to repair to, to seek for succoure." Our forefathers made the church the heart and center of their first New England communities. They are pictured going 100 percent to their house of worship, even carrying guns as they tramped through the snow, to protect themselves from savages lurking in the surrounding forests.




