# BAPTIST WORLD ALLIANCE DAY 1988 The Tie that Binds

You are not alone today as you worship God.
The Holy Spirit reassures you of the living presence of Jesus Christ.

People are physically present here in the service with you. Perhaps friends or family are beside you. Someone is in front, others are behind you. Choir members will stand to sing. Preachers will face you and speak from God's holy word. You are not alone.

You are not alone in spirit either. In some 130,000 churches around the world, the Baptists are at worship. Add to that a great number of mission points and preaching stations where

Christians who believe as you do gather this Lord's Day. With 35 million baptized members, and counting a "community" of family members and others attending, world Baptists are praying, singing, giving, proclaiming, studying, inviting, committing, serving. Just like you there in your place, the Baptists are in their places at worship in other cities, other provinces or states, other countries.

Some wear shoes, and some wear suits. Some have scarves on, some carry umbrellas. Some walked to their place of worship, some came by boat, some took a train. Some sing from hymnals with blue covers, some from green. Some sit in pews, some stand. Some have skin of red, others of yellow or white or black. Some are young, some are not. There are many differences of language and culture.

But every member of the world family of Baptists has this in common with you: Each one loves the Lord Jesus Christ and knows he died for human sin. Each one believes that the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is life eternal in Jesus Christ his Son. Each one believes he or she must tell others the gospel message until it reaches around the world. This is the way it touches your life. This is how it touches other individuals, bringing them to know God in Christ.

The BAPTIST WORLD ALLIANCE is the international organization for this world family of Baptists. Through a national Baptist union or convention working in one of 143 countries of our globe, you and your local congregation are a part of the BWA.

From its international office near Washington, D.C., the BAPTIST WORLD ALLIANCE assists Baptists in training for evangelism and in Christian education, in mutual aid programs and in times of human need, in Baptist studies and research, in an international communications network, and in funding efforts to support such ministries on a world scale.

Through departments of women's, men's and youth work, the BWA schedules lay leadership programs, prayer projects, fellowship and learning conferences.

Each year, the BWA General Council meets to discuss and react to human rights, religious liberty and other special concerns of its constituent bodies. And in August 1990, the 16th Baptist World Congress is scheduled in Seoul, Korea, as a worldwide celebration for Baptists everywhere.

You are not alone today as you worship God. You are not alone in "helping the hurting — through Jesus Christ."





### Our Joyous Witness: Living the Gospel


Paul wrote to the church in Ephesus, "I therefore, a prisoner for the Lord, beg you to lead a life worthy of the calling to which you have been called" (Ephesians 4:1, RSV). These words bring each of us to a moment of reflection. What does it mean to live a life worthy of the calling to which we have been called? To many persons, Paul's words mean being a good steward of all of life.

Have you ever known a person who was a steward of all his or her life resources? If you have, I'm sure that you noted that two of the characteristics of this person's faith were joy and excitement. To know such a person is to know the contagion of an uplifting faith.

For me such a person was a petite lady in her late eighties. Every morning Mrs. Penrose would arise early for her devotions and prayers. She said this was her time of strengthening. After an early breakfast she would work in her yard when the weather permitted. The work was not so much to keep the yard free of weeds but to give her an opportunity to share her faith with those who walked by her home. For those not in too much of a hurry, a moment spent in looking over the flowers or talking to her about the latest concerns brought a lift of spirit. In a concerned but knowing way she would finish the conversation with a word of assurance that everything is in God's keeping. Quietly yet powerfully she demonstrated the importance of letting the joy and excitement of one's faith be seen. As with things of greatest value, across the years the quiet witness of this dear friend has grown even more rich. The joyous witness that she gave has brought me many times to consider also the joyous sharing of my own faith.

The theme chosen for our America for Christ offering points us to such a call—"Our Joyous Witness: Living the Gospel." The witness we bring must be not only something we talk about but also something we joyfully show.

### Say, Mister, I Forgot to Tell You . . .

There was a story told some years ago about a man looking in a store window at a beautiful picture of the crucifixion. A scruffy-looking street child came up and stood next to the man. Wondering if the little urchin really understood the picture, the man asked, "Son, what does it mean?"

"Doncha know?" the child answered, "that there man is Jesus and them others is Roman soldiers, and the woman that's cryin' is his mother, and—they killed him."

The man turned away and in a moment heard pattering footsteps behind him. The little boy said breathlessly, "Say, Mister, I forgot

to tell you, but he rose again!"

"I forgot to tell you." It seems to me that a good many Christians and any number of churches have forgotten that the whole gospel is empty and relatively meaningless except as it is validated by the resurrection of Jesus.

The resurrection is *the* decisive event in the whole story of our God who became human to show us the way to life—abundant and eternal. Yet, how often do our lives—our actions, our words, our thoughts—reflect the joy and confident strength that was manifested in the lives of the first disciples following the resurrection of their Master?

They were changed persons. You can read the Gospels and other New Testament books and see the evidence of the power of the resurrection to transform them into an unconquerable people.


What about us? What about our churches? For example, do we go Sundays to worship with a keen sense of celebration and joy in the Lord? Do we worship with some sense of new life, or is it all rather routine, dull, stuffy, and deadly predictable?

I would hope we Christians and we churches would keep reminding ourselves that the power of Jesus' resurrection and the consequent joy and celebration that it produces in our lives and in the lives of our churches needs to be let loose—not only on Easter but fifty-two weeks a year!

Then, not only will our lives be enriched and meaningful but we will also be witnessing to others that in the living Christ there is *life!*

Perhaps our greatest God-given bond, regardless of race or religious denomination, is our common humanity. The foundation of Judeo-Christian tradition has been built upon the cornerstone-belief that all men and women were created in the image and likeness of their God, a God of compassion and love.

As old stereotypes reflecting fear and ignorance crumble away, more and more people realize that men, women and children with mental retardation are valuable people to know as neighbors and friends.






Easter is more than springtime, eggs, and bunnies. The message of Easter is "Now is Christ risen!" And his resurrection relates to the realities of life.

Our Lord's resurrection took place in our real world, where death seems to have the last word. Theologian Karl Barth wrote, "The resurrection did not take place in a heavenly or supra-heavenly realm, or as part of an intra-divine movement or a divine conversation, but before the gates of Jerusalem in the days of Tiberias Caesar and therefore in the place and time which are also ours, in our sphere."

Our Lord's resurrection gives meaning to our dying. In the closing days of World War II, the Nazis took Dietrich Bonhoeffer from his cell in Flossenburg prison to be executed. His last words were to his fellow prisoner: "This is . . . for me the beginning of life!"

Our Lord's resurrection gives meaning to our current experience. Methodism's founder, John Wesley, wrote: "I believe in the resurrection not because I can explain it, but because it happened to me." Martin Luther made the same point when he spoke of a "Christ-filled world."

Our Lord's resurrection should also be seen in our lives and witness. When actor Ben Kingsley arrived in a small village in India, he was made up and costumed as Gandhi, ready to shoot a scene. As he got out of the car, some villagers knelt down to kiss his feet. He quickly remonstrated and said that he was only playing the part of Gandhi. They responded, "We know that, but through you he will live again." Our risen Lord is in us not only for our comfort but for our witness. Through this witness he will live again in the hearts of others.

#### From One Generation To The Next




"Take to heart," comes the reassuring voice, "you are the chosen ones of God . . . remember what God has already done for you . . . look to the past to have hope for the future."




I remember a turning point and moment of enlightment for myself as a parent. My son was in a bad mood and beginning to express it. On this particular occasion he struck me with his hand in anger. Automatically I reacted by slapping his hand, and as I did, I shouted at him, "Don't ever hit anyone!"

Then a light flashed in my mind. I struck him while telling him that he was not to hit anyone. I'm confident that he felt the conflict between what I said and what I did. I wondered for a moment, but regretfully I knew then that he was only imitating me even then. He had done his homework and had learned his lessons well. When he struck me in anger, I saw myself.

During this week why don't we be imitators of Christ in yet another way? He called us to an awareness of our weaknesses and reminded us of the necessity of confession. Another healing moment in my life occurred when I was able to confess honestly to my son that I had made a mistake in the way in which I had corrected him. Then I asked for his forgiveness. Guess what happened! He forgave me, but then he imitated me! He confessed his own feelings of failure as a son. It was a joyous moment as our forgiveness of each other healed our apartness.

• Are we a "crown to the aged"? Have we brought joy to the hearts of our precious grandmothers?


• What more can we do, and encourage our children to do, to add sparkle and shine to that crown?


#### FAITH OF OUR MOTHERS

- 1 Faith of our mothers, living still In cradle song and bedtime prayer; In nursery lore and fireside love, Thy presence still pervades the air; Faith of our mothers, living faith! We will be true to thee till death.
- 2 Faith of our mothers, loving faith, Fount of our childhood's trust and grace Oh, may thy consecration prove Source of a finer, nobler race; Faith of our mothers, living faith, We will be true to thee till death.
- 3 Faith of our mothers, guiding faith, For youthful longing, youthful doubt, How blurred our vision, blind our way, Thy providential care without; Faith of our mothers, living faith, We will be true to thee till death.
- 4 Faith of our mothers, Christian faith, In truth beyond our stumbling creeds, Still serve the home and save the Church, And breath thy spirit thro' our deeds; (refrain)

Our Baptist heritage is exemplified in the call and commitment of those Indian and non-Indian Christian leaders who have gone before us and left the impact of the ministry of Jesus Christ upon us. In 1891 Lone Wolf, a Kiowa chief, was told the story of a Savior whose love included Indians. Lone Wolf realized that the best future for his people lay along the Jesus road, so he sent a call to the American Baptist Home Mission Society: "Please come to this Lone Wolf mission; I want you to tell me what I and my people must do."

At the Baptist Missionary Training School in Chicago, a missionary, Eliza J. Quinton, told the students of the dire need among the Plains Indian tribes in western Indian territory. Marietta Reeside responded, "That is my call! Send me!" On a hot August day in 1892, she was introduced as the missionary who had come to live among them to teach them of Jesus and to establish a church and school. Lone Wolf, Big Tree, Stumbling Bear, and Poor Buffalo, chiefs of the Kiowas, each took the hand of Miss Reeside and promised loyalty and cooperation. Today the family of God has become bigger and bigger as God's Spirit bears witness with our spirit that we are the children of God. Rev. Kim Mammedaty, a Kiowa woman, responded as American Baptist men and women, Native Americans, Hispanics, Asians, Blacks, and Anglos have responded before her: "That's my call! Send me!"



For nearly two thousand years the church has pondered the meaning of Pentecost, the day it celebrates as its birthday. Miracle and mystery are inextricably woven into the event, as Luke records it in Acts 2. Wind and fire, sound and touch and sight, all were heard and felt and seen by the disciples on that momentous occasion when the Holy Spirit was given to the church as an enduring presence (in contrast to the occasional appearances of the Spirit in the Old Testament).

Sometimes I find it helpful to focus upon one aspect of such a wondrous account, letting my mind dwell upon a particular feature of the whole picture. Think of the "tongues of fire" that separated and came to rest on the disciples (Acts 2:3). Fire represents the Spirit's power and light. It depicts the creative might by which God accomplishes all the divine purposes and displays the brilliant glory that accompanies the divine presence. It symbolizes the luminous truth that displaces the darkness of ignorance and sin and gives forth the knowledge of Jesus Christ the Redeemer. As God's permanent gift to the church, the Spirit has come as fire to empower and enlighten the people of God.

The Spirit comes not only to the people together but also to each member. Although our society welcomes that emphasis upon the gift of the Spirit to individuals, it must note that "they were all together in one place" when the Spirit came upon them. To the church at worship the Spirit was given. May we today receive anew

the Pentecostal gifts of power and light.






1. If a child goes along hitting people, saying bad words, and doing bad things—this is what he/she will be judged on.

#### Teach Them the Right Way to Live

In his later years the esteemed Spanish artist, Pablo Picasso, visited an exhibition of children's drawings. Moved by the creativity of their work, he observed, "When I was their age I could draw like Raphael, but it took me a lifetime to learn to draw like them."


theologian Picasso was not, but his words offer an insight that all adults need to hear on this day that we set aside to honor fathers: We are called by God not only to teach children, but to allow children to teach us.

I must confess that I often find it easier to talk to children than to listen to them; that I find it more satisfying to answer questions than to ask them; and that I value experience more than I do innocence.

As the father of a delightful 18-month-old, I take pride in my role as a teacher. Our son understands that a hug is an expression of affection, that a push is a symbol of hostility, and that the former is preferred in our household. He realizes that sharing his toys conveys acceptance of another, that hoarding reflects exclusion, and that the latter is not acceptable behavior.

Jonathan's mother and I have taught him some important skills, but, like Picasso, we are beginning to understand that he has taught us even more. His joy, laughter, and lack of pretense have helped us better understand why Jesus insisted that our busy lives do not keep us from relating to children. His trust, dependency, and unconditional love have reminded us of true kingdom virtues. He has taught us an old lesson that we had forgotten: In the final analysis, we are all God's children, and it is God who provides us guidance and support as we seek "the right way to live."



God's love and mercy are always with me. Just as the ocean will not be moved, so God's mercy is constantly with those who fear him.




Unfortunately, there isn't much nurturing and flourishing going on in a good number of churches at this time of year. Church school is cancelled; midweek studies are recessed; worship attendance drops off, and offerings are meager. In our church, attendance and offerings are one-third lower in July and August than during the rest of the year. Instead of a fertile field, many churches bear a greater resemblance to a desert wasteland.

Christians desperately need to recover the biblical concept of *community*. We need each other, and we must assemble regularly throughout the year if faith is to mature and mission to be fulfilled. Yes, Christian faith is personal, but it is also corporate. Acts 2:42-47 describes faith being built in the context of community. In his letters Paul addresses the needs of specific Christian communities.

There is no justification for letting summer activities crowd out my responsibilities to God's people and God's mission, and when they do, I certainly can't expect much flourishing to go on in God's house.

Are you "planted" in the Lord's house in the summer months? Are you like a July corn stalk, mightily winding its way toward the skies? Or is the word "uprooted" a more fit description of your summer stewardship? "Those that be planted in the house of the LORD shall flourish." Let's flourish together!



As a child, the Bible stories that told of Jesus by the Sea of Galilee held a special appeal for me. In my childish imagination I readily entered into those dramatic moments in our Savior's life that took place by its waters.

There he calmed the violent storm, mysteriously walked upon its waters, directed defeated fishermen to their greatest catch, and cooked a mean as a sign of his physical resurrection. Yes, mighty

events occurred by that fabled sea.

Yet of all those grand events one other stands out as having greatest import for everyday Christian living. It has to do with a sentence Jesus spoke to two surprised fishermen; a sentence which echoes unceasingly from its shores, challenging millions of believers. He said to Peter and his brother Andrew, "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men" (Matthew 4:19). Ever since, the shores of the Sea of Galilee are hallowed as the birthplace of Christian discipleship and evangelism.

Peter and Andrew understood the words of Jesus in ways difficult for us to do. For many of us, fishing is an occasional weekend or holiday treat. For Peter and Andrew it defined their personal identity and spelled out their life vocation. Undoubtedly, it was this latter meaning Jesus had in mind when he gave their daily task a new


spiritual meaning.

The call to Peter and Andrew have become the call to all Christ's disciples. It may not be a call to leave our present vocations to become pastors and missionaries. It is a call, however, to find ways whereby all our daily tasks can be transformed into instruments to draw people to Jesus. Have you accepted his challenge?

# Be Still and Know That I Am God

Dr. Owen Owens, in a new meditation journal for American Baptists, makes these suggestions regarding the power and impact

of prayer in the life of Christians.

"God is in control today. Those churches which help people learn to pray will find loving energies released to their people. Prayer is response to God. It is easier than breathing, closer than a heartbeat. Why then must we learn to pray? Because we have fallen away from the real presence of God in our lives, we have to relearn that simple faith of children. Enjoy prayer. Find out in your own experience what the earliest disciples learned when they asked Jesus, "Teach us to pray."


Although prayer is a response to God, Dr. Owens recommends active participation. He suggests that people should keep a daily prayer journal to record reflections and learnings. In addition, he urges that every prayer be accompanied by some action step that the person can take in order to strengthen one's faith and see the power

of God at work.

He writes: "Jot down your planned action steps as well as other requests you have made of God, and watch expectantly for answered prayer. Notice the effects of your action steps each day. See what the answers to prayer may be. Remember that every second God is working to bring into being that which is good, right, true and loving. This is God's nature. Each moment, therefore, can be a time of revelation just as it was for Jesus and the disciples."


"miracle"-something given from the gods.




It's appropriate for this Labor Day weekend to be talking about service to our God. Such service is a "labor of love" as we reach out and touch others with the joyous message of the gospel.

# KNOWING THE DIRECTION

Some years ago someone shared an old adage with me. It went, "If you don't know where you are going, any road will do." Following that bit of sage advice came a heavy emphasis on setting goals and objectives. Both of these emphasize the importance of having an understanding of desired results.


The trained ministry of the church requires a clear sense of direction. Jesus gave a clear mandate to make disciples, to baptize them and to teach them to observe all of his commandments. These teachings do set the direction: (1) to make persons learn about Jesus, (2) to help them declare their commitment, and (3) to help them incorporate his orders into personal lifestyles.

Our theme Scripture for the day indicates there is also a matter of setting life priorities. In Matthew 6:33 we read, "Seek ye first the kingdom of God" (KJV). This primary focus would direct the orientation of our thoughts and lives, as well as our work of re-orienting the pace and quality of life around us.

Christian Education Week is a good time to check our direction and objectives for the church, as well as for our individual lives. Are they in tune with the teachings of Jesus, or are we settling for lesser achievements?

By Christ's own teaching we are told that in placing his concerns first our needs will be met.



# By Faith the Challenge Continues

The central truth of the Lord's Supper has to do with the death of Christ, the shattering of a life. The elements of bread and wine that we share focus for us the event where life was broken. The brokenness of our own experience and the brokenness of our world draws us back to the crucifixion.

The Table merges sadness into joy. These broken things enable us to celebrate the pathway to healing and wholeness. The symbols point us to both death and deliverance. Jesus made these common things the story of his sorrow and of the grace of God.


These broken things proclaim the Word of God in the midst of unbelief. The words of redemption are set forth by Jesus to weak and unbelieving people. We see a world that contains bitterness, selfishness, and considerable hatred. Such a world needs to hear the Good News.

The challenge to address a broken world in Christ's name continues today as a mandate of our faith. Even as Adoniram Judson responded to God's call to take the message of God's love to "all the world," we are invited to continue the process. The World Fellowship Offering allows us to share the Good News in the midst of hatred, bitterness, and selfishness to the ends of the earth, even as we are called to share Good News across the fence and across the street in person.

Hateful, bitter, selfish people can be changed to new beings through the Word of the Cross. God uses death—the death of Christ—to accomplish life. In Christ it is possible for hatred to become love; bitterness to experience life-giving forgiveness, and selfishness to turn into joyful selfdenial.

The invitation to Christ's Table implies a call to men and women of today who are ready to share Good News in "all the world." The World Fellowship Offering is a major way we as an American Baptist family can sustain and enable the witness to meet the continuing challenge.


# "SEE THE SALVATION OF OUR GOD"

# THE MYSTERIES BEHIND THAT CLOSED DOOR


Jesus makes it very clear that the "door" is open to all people. What they discover on the other side, however, depends on whether they go through with him.

# LAYMEN'S SUNDAY Together in Mission


-I Corinthians 3:1-9

My electrician neighbor took one look at what I'd done and let out a laugh. He said, "This looks like a church meeting trying to vote on something. Let's see if we can get them to work together and get the light on." He deftly clipped and combined the "spaghetti" into a simple connection. Everything easily fit into the box and the light worked. My neighbor knows his business. No fuss, no muss, no bother...just do the job you are trained to do and do it right the first time.

In 1 Corinthians 3:1-9 the apostle Paul took his Christian neighbors to task. They were so intent on arguing over who was right that they lost sight not only of their common mission in Christ but of God who made that mission possible in the first place! "A church meeting trying to vote on something."

I marvel at the vast number of books that have been and continue to be written to show Christians how to live their lives. The sheer amount of words on paper is mind-boggling. In the end it may come down to this: a person's closeness to God can be gauged by watching how that person treats other people. Can you imagine what might happen if we actually got together in God's mission? Now that really would be mind-boggling!





# SEEK THEM OUT AND CELEBRATE TODAY!





<sup>66</sup> And you will have joy and gladness and many will rejoice at His birth." (Luke 1:14/RSV)


Fifteen months ago, my spouse and I became parents for the first time. When we went to the doctor the first time and heard him say, "you are pregnant!" we rejoiced. Soon we were able to hold our daughter for the first time.

Nearly 2,000 years ago another couple, Elizabeth and Zechariah, became parents to John the Baptist. In this text the angel greeted Zechariah in the temple and informed him of the conception of John the Baptist. Zechariah learned who his son would be and was told by the angel that "many will rejoice at His birth."

Elizabeth and Zechariah were confused and shocked by this news. Elizabeth was beyond childbearing years and Zechariah was older. John the Baptist was not conceived in a conventional manner, but his birth and life are symbolized in the candle on this bulletin cover: as a light to many. John proclaimed that he was not the Light, but the one who was to prepare the way for the Light.

On this second Sunday of Advent, we are reminded of John the Baptist's life. His life was simple but significant as a preparer for the Messiah. May the candle on this bulletin and the advent wreaths of the season remind us of John the Baptist, the preparer for the Light. May we "rejoice at His birth."

For many centuries the hymn of praise Mary sang when visiting her cousin, Elizabeth, has been sung in Christian churches in its Latin form, *Magnificat anima mea Dominum*, and is now often referred to as the Magnificat. Mary marvels at God's choice of her to bear his Son and sings his praises, not only for the blessings she has and will experience, but also for the faithfulness and power of God that have been evident in his continued guidance of Israel throughout the generations.


Originally, to magnify meant to extol, exalt, praise, as used by Mary. Our present-day use alters the word to mean "to increase the perceived size of."

Consider the magnifying glass. What wonders appear in the item examined! Minute structures, variations in color, many details become clear as we peer at them through the magnifying glass.

Mary praised and rejoiced in God her Savior, for her present experience and for the anticipated blessings her Child would bring to her and others. As we approach the celebration of our Savior's birth, let us find ways to magnify the Lord to enable others to see him more clearly: credit him for the blessings of everyday life; testify in actions as well as words that others might find in God their source of strength and joy; celebrate our Savior's birth to reveal the immensity, power and love of God who invaded history as a Baby to provide the salvation we could not perform ourselves!

# You Shall Call His Name Jesus. (Luke 1:31)


The story begins in Nazareth and ends in Bethlehem. It begins with a frightened young woman standing in awe of a heavenly visitor and concludes with a mother who knows that she has delivered into the world a very special person.



"For to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord" (Luke 2:11)


