They assumed it was a branch or an animal, but much to their terror it was an elderly woman lying in the street! They stopped the car to assist her and found out this woman had somehow strayed from a nursing home. She had managed to remove her IV's and wander out of the home. She later collapsed in the street, where my friends found her. They stayed with the woman till the ambulance came to pick her up. If they hadn't stopped, this woman could have died.

How often do we pass a situation or a person that needs help and fail to stop? Perhaps we call on our car phone and trust that someone else will stop and help. We may be thinking only of being late for an appointment, but we as Christians must rise above this kind of thinking! We need to be willing to get dirty for God, to offer a helping hand even when it means personal inconvenience and possible risk. We must put our faith and compassion into action. I'm sure that woman was glad someone took the time to help. Will we be doers of the Word or just comfortable callers?

* Standing In Worship

Everyone who makes himself great will be humbled (Luke 18:14, GNB).

Jesus contrasted the prayers of a self-righteous Pharisee and repentant tax collector: ". . . for all who exalt themselves will be humbled, but all who humble themselves will be exalted" (Luke 18:14, NRSV). In God's logic the last are first, the least become the greatest, and the humble are exalted! God turns the wisdom of this world upside down and the unexpected becomes the expected.

The religious leaders of the first century expected a Messiah with might and power. But Messiah's advent was in a lowly stable among the powerless in an obscure corner of the Mediterranean world. An unexpected Savior was born in Bethlehem.


It is because we follow a God who upends the predictable things of this world that Christians have hope. God can change the political scenarios and economic forecasts. God can intervene in the decay of the environment. God can upset the demographic apple carts of the futurists. And we are partners with God, empowered by the Holy Spirit to "turn the tables," to make the unexpected and unpredictable happen.

One small but important way we can reverse a trend is to care for persons in the process of moving. North Americans are a mobile society with nearly 20% of the population changing residences every year. It is expected that moving persons get "lost in the shuffle," experience the stress of uprootedness, lose the social and moral glue that nearness to family and friends provides, and often drop out of church. American Baptists can help the unexpected happen by calling ABC-Find when church members move. This free ministry assists moving persons in finding a new church home and receive a welcome from a sister Baptist church in a new community.
