

Our participation in the Good News at the Center is to provide for Marian and others one small place that is inviting and safe. A place where we encourage them to see good possibilities for their lives and to make choices toward realizing some of those possibilities.

Marian has already made choices for life that many in this neighborhood do not make. I pray for her the same sense of possibility that Lori has...that she can come still closer to what God desires for her.



"A member of our congregation met a homeless man in the streets of our city. The next day, when we were together, he saw the man again and introduced him to me. His name was Pedro. The man from our congregation took Pedro to lunch and brought him to evening services, where he had an opportunity to hear the Good News of the Gospel. That evening we went to an abandoned house where the Cuban man had lived for two weeks during the cold Fort Wayne winter. I gave him a heavy jacket, and on Monday morning went with him to place some job applications.

Pedro now has a good job and lives with the brother who found him. One Sunday morning, Pedro walked forward with tears in his eyes and said that he had accepted Jesus Christ into his heart and wanted to follow him."

United Mission dollars from American Baptist Churches of Indiana helped to start La Iglesia del Pueblo. American Baptists, united in mission, are helping people like Pedro find homes in the family of Jesus Christ.

A Time to Remember


This is the way of God's creation. These "times" are interacting...they complement one another. As children of God this is what makes us truly whole persons.



Pilgrims Yesterday, Today and Tomorrow




Isaiah 2:1-5

Food That Satisfies



Vision

An interesting sidelight of the Christmas story is the meeting of Joseph, Mary, and the Child with the old Jewish mystic, Simeon. Simeon's prayer, known as the "Nunc Dimittis," has come down to us as one of the church's most beautiful liturgical expressions.

Little is known of Simeon. Luke pictures an obscure and insignificant old man frequenting the temple precincts, sustained and invigorated by a vision and a hope. Whatever it was precisely, it kept him alive beyond threescore and ten years. Simeon was a man who trusted and followed his intuition. Thus, at the promptings of the Spirit, he made his way into the temple at the precise point at which, according to Jewish prescription, the child Jesus was being formally presented to the Lord. This was his moment! How did he know? He just knew. In the shape-strange sight!-of a peasant woman's child he beheld the salvation of Israel and humanity. Without this vision there can be no Christmas.


God Is With Us


