
Ephesians 3:9



# Sending Out and Gathering In

A church planter was hot and tired, going door to door during the heat of the day. Five hours had passed, and it seemed that no one wanted to hear about Jesus, let alone about starting a new church. And then he found an interested family. They were fascinated by the fact that he was actually starting a church. "Why are you starting a church?" they asked. He replied. "Because Jesus loves you, and he wants to be involved in your life." They had seen Christian television, had some Christian friends, but had never accepted Jesus personally. They had never known Jesus face to face. Not only did they accept Jesus, but they also came to the new church and were baptized at the first baptismal service.

There are many out there in your neighborhood who know a little about Jesus, but they have not encountered him face to face. The most effective means of evangelism is starting a new church. Notice that Paul not only brought people to Jesus, but he also started new churches in the process. Where does God want you to share the gospel? It might be in the beginning of a new church! On which door does the Lord want you to knock?

# Surrounded by Witnesses

The 1994 conference season is the fifty-first for the American Baptist Assembly (ABA). ABA was purchased in 1943, and the first conferences were held in 1944. Last year and this year, Green Lake is celebrating its fiftieth birthday.

The golden anniversary theme is "Celebrating a Half Century of Witness! The Mission Before Us!" The Scripture text is Hebrews 12:1-2. In the great eleventh chapter of Hebrews, the author sets forth a beautiful litany of faith-full men and women of God: Enoch,


the parents of Moses, Rahab, Joseph, and many others.

ABA's litany is found most concisely in the fortieth anniversary book, *The Walk Continues*, by Larry Janssen, and in the ten year update by John Barbour: Luther Wesley Smith, James L. Kraft, Richard Hoiland, John Dawson, Adele Norman Silke, Joseph Hanson, Harold Richardson, Frances Lamb, Roger Fredrikson, Pearl Rosser, Lois Blankenship, William McKee, William R. Nelson, Roger Getz, Charles Boddie, Omer E. Robbins, Mildred Thurston, Fred and Anne Pillsbury. To paraphrase the author of Hebrews, "Should I go on? There isn't space enough to write of the many other men and women, past and present, rich and poor, known and unknown, who have been faith-full servants for God's mission at Green Lake."

Some of these servants are now among the "cloud of witnesses." They have passed the ABA torch to us and are cheering us onward toward the goal. They call us to "lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely" and to "run with perseverance the race that is set before us"—and, yes, above all, to keep our eyes on Jesus.

Surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses! This is cause for gratitude, humility, renewed vision, courage, and determination. May it be so in your life, in your church, and in our American Baptist family! May it be so at the American Baptist Assembly, the "homeplace" for the family!



# **Church Vocations Sunday**


The Holy Spirit calls gifted and capable people to be set apart for special ministries of the church. God does the calling, and expects us to help. We often see or know people who are considering or who should consider a church-related vocation. Each local congregation is part of the network that is to give serious attention to the God-given task of enlisting, nurturing, and supporting people for professional church leadership.

The main emphases of Acts 13:1-3 are the work of the Holy Spirit in calling people to minister through church-related vocations and the role of the church in validating the call and sending forth people into ministry. The passage, coupled with Ephesians 4:11-12, emphasizes that the local church must look within itself for people needed in Christian service for the building up of the body of Christ.

The church at Antioch expected that God would call and people would respond. As the Spirit moved in Antioch, so the same movement flows through our churches today. While the church in Antioch was worshiping, instructions came to set apart those to do the work to which they had been called. Paul and Barnabas were released from their present task to fulfill the new task to which they had been called and were sent forth to use their gifts.

How might you and your church help nurture a climate where calls can be heard and where support is provided so that ministry can be undertaken? Expect that people will be "called and sent forth" from your church.

# A REFUGEE STORY

My name is Rodman Johnson.
I am 10 years old and was born in Liberia.
Now I live on the west side of Buffalo,
New York with my mom, two brothers,
three sisters, and one cousin. This is
my story.

July 2,1990 we awoke with the sound of guns as we found our house surrounded by rebels. We were ordered to leave home, knowing not where we would go.

My dad, my mom, my brothers and sisters and ten other relatives joined a Crowd of more than 20,000 people who were also searching for safety.

Our journey was rough. There was no water, food, or clothes. But we survived by God's grace.


On August 5, after my mom was threatened by rebels, we set off for the Ivory Coast in a bus.

We remained on the Ivory Coast for two years. Then we took off for the USA, arriving here on August 21, 1992.

My dad went back in search of my grandmother. We don't know if she's fine or not.

I am praying for the war to end so I can see my dad and other relatives once again. I also miss my dear homeland, Liberia, very much, even though I am glad to be in America.

Rodman won a prize for his true story in the "I am an Author" Chapter 1 reading program at the Central Library in Buffalo, New York. His family was sponsored by the Delaware Avenue Baptist Church. Pastor Ron Tryon says, "Rodman and his family are wonderful people who have suffered a lot and need our prayers."



# **Rain Clouds and Rainbows**

At this first Sunday in Lent, we tend to look at the broken promises of the past year and of past relationships. Our hearts can be overwhelmed by the hurt and pain of walking through our relational graveyard. Regret can freeze us, restraining us from trying to reach out again.

One thing we can always count on is God's faithfulness. With rain clouds comes the rainbow, reminding us that God is true to his promises. Although we may stray, God is ever faithful and draws us near. With all the rain clouds over our cities, towns, and communities, we tend not to look up and see the rainbows, to see what God is doing. Planting a church is one of the rainbows God gives a community. It is tangible evidence that God is true to his Word. Maybe it is time for your community to see the rainbow of the Lord. It might be time for you to shine forth and help start a new church. Maybe the Lord wants to begin in you a fresh relationship with himself and with other people. The reality of God's promise can't be known by those who only know the clouds. It could be the Lord is counting on you to begin to shine!

# Single Adult Awareness Sunday

It has been said that change is the one constant in life. To the extent that we can affirm the truth in that statement, we can also

identify constants that come as a direct result of change.

In the case of Ruth and her appeal to Naomi for permission to remain by her side, we have a strong reminder of how complex choices can get. At the same time that she is committing herself to keeping their relationship the same, Ruth is opening herself to the most dramatic and severe of changes. In fact, both Ruth and Naomi were surrounded by changes: recently widowed, pulling up old roots, looking for new roots and meaning, facing many options, needing to take some definitive action in their lives, and suddenly "single." Neither elder nor younger is exempt from change.

The time of dramatic and sweeping change we now live in and attempt to cope with shapes our future, individual and collective, in ways most unpredictable. "Naomi teaches us that there is 'a time to speak and a time to keep silent,' a time to entreat and a time to refrain from entreating, a time to argue and a time to yield in the argument, a time even when parents should concede to the wishes of their children, though contrary to their own judgment" (Braden).\*







# **Palm Sunday**




truth rather than the prophet of one of these religions?


As you read this, a church will be born somewhere in the world. How? With the same three biblical principles that have propelled the church from Jerusalem to every continent:



As young bride whose husband worked the night shift in a service station, I found it hard to go to sleep alone, fearing not only for my own safety but for that of my mate. A retired missionary friend suggested that I repeat Psalm 4:8 as a way of calming myself and strengthening my trust in God's care.

Later when we served as missionaries in Zaire and Thailand, I took great comfort in this Scripture as we experienced violent political upheavals and culture shock. One night in a Lahu tribal village in northern Thailand where I was participating in a week of weaving meminars, I fell into exhausted sleep on the floor of the pastor's house. The only other person in the room was Dee Nelson, a mission ary coworker. About midnight I awoke and realized the packed full of slumbering, snoring strangers. The panic I felt was real—for our safety as well as from having our personal space invended. The next morning I learned they were a gospel team from the Lahu Bible School.

Whet her our fears are real or imagined, or only the result of cultural differences, God is faithful in sharing his peace with us.



that grace becomes flesh in Jesus Christ.



#### **Rebuilding Homes, Rebuilding Lives**

isaster often strikes quickly and without warning. Yet long after the headlines fade, the victims of war, famine, earthquake, and flood must struggle to rebuild their homes and, often, their lives.

It will not be easy for the millions of war victims in the former Yugoslavia to rebuild their homes and lives. Still mourning the loss of loved ones who have died in the bitter civil war, survivors must face the losses of home, community, and employment. Many do not know where their next meal will come from—or where they will find shelter....

It will not be easy for residents of Northridge, California to rebuild their homes and lives. Following the earthquake that destroyed their homes last January, thousands of Californians continue to fear for their future. They fear they will lose their homes for good. They fear for their jobs. They fear going to bed at night....

It is not easy for 16,000 young African boys waiting in the Kakuma Refugee Camp in Kenya to hope for a better life. Many of the boys, ages 12 to 20, were impressed into military service and forced to clear minefields. Their missing limbs are reminders of their cruel treatment. They hope to be reunited with their families and rebuild their lives—someday....

It has not been easy for flood victims in the US Midwest to recover from the raging waters that deprived them of their possessions, their farms and businesses, churches and homes. Many are retired or elderly people on fixed incomes. Farmers, who had no harvest last year, now have no money to plant again. Rebuilding a business, a home, a life can take a very long time.

One Great Hour of Sharing gives American Baptists an opportunity to relieve some of the seemingly endless suffering in our world. We can make a difference. Grain, blankets, clothing, counseling, education, medical supplies, hammers, dry wall, seeds, technical assistance—are building blocks that enable the oppressed, the depressed, and the discouraged to begin to reconstruct their homes, their confidence, and their lives.

Jesus reached out in love and compassion to those who suffered around him. We can do the same through *One Great Hour of Sharing*. Our generous gifts to the American Baptist World Relief Offering give hope, help, love—and life.

#### **Baptist Heritage Day**

The Gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles were written by a physician/historian. His precise mind made him attentive to detail, truth, and accuracy. It seemed good to him, as one who had followed the events of Jesus' ministry closely, to write an "orderly account" for Theophilus so that he might know the truth concerning the things of which he had been informed.

Luke was called by God to preserve both the story of the life of Jesus and the history of the apostolic church. God calls people of every generation to the special task of preserving the history of the church, its mission and its ministry. The entire story is never told, but some of the events are recorded to guide and inspire present and future generations.


In 1909 Mary Elizabeth Trowbridge wrote the *History of Baptists in Michigan*. It is a wonderful account of the experience of the earliest Baptist settlers there and the missional pastors who ministered to them. This wife of a Michigan pastor wrote of events she had followed closely. She understood well the role of women in the churches and produced a balanced and complete history.

Other women historians, such as Helen Barrett Montgomery, Bertha Grimmell Judd, and Marietta Hooper Safford, also responded to the call to write orderly accounts of events they had witnessed by recording the stories of women missionaries and those at home who recruited and supported them. Baptist women historians are few, but their work is vitally important because they include people and events often overlooked.

Our precious heritage—the wonderful stories of those men and women who have affected the world so profoundly—is available to us because of the efforts of Baptist historians who have faithfully followed Luke's example.


In Old Testament Scriptures many things are prescribed—when to celebrate God's holy days, how and what to eat, how much of one's produce must be given on the altar. God carefully offered specific guidelines for those who were struggling to be faithful.

Jesus was not always as specific. In coming to earth to show us the spirit of the law of God, he often left the details up to us—telling us to love one another is not nearly as precise as writing laws upon tablets of stone! The apostle Paul also lived his life by the spirit of the law. Since God has given us everything in abundance, we should respond with great generosity—much as Paul did by voluntarily devoting his life to the gospel.

However, devotion is hard to measure in times such as ours. Short of giving up everything, how do we know how much is enough to constitute a "cheerful giver"? When driving to a place we have never before visited, we often take a map. When paying a bill in a restaurant, we can find it helpful to have a chart to figure the appropriate tip for the server. In deciding "how much is enough" as we respond to God's grace by giving to the church, why not start with the Old Testament standard—the tithe? Counting in tenths was a legal requirement for the Israelites. Jesus set us free by bringing the gift of grace, and asked for even more than a tenth in return. Paul encouraged us to make up our minds to give gladly as much as possible.

God loves cheerful givers. God also wants us to measure carefully and weigh deliberately our response to the blessings of God's love. Tithing, giving 10 percent of one's income to the work of God through the church, is a practical, biblical, and cheerful way to give.

#### Unknown But to God

They say that Arlington National Cemetery is nearly out of room. Unless they go to double graves, few will be buried there in coming years.


On the hillside above that beautiful spot are the graves of the "Unknowns" from World War I, World War II, Korea, and Vietnam. The bodies of many service persons killed in action were unidentifiable. Their bodies could not be returned for burial. So, bodies of unknown service persons have been buried at Arlington symbolizing all those lost but unidentified.

Daily there is a military guard on duty. Daily people come to visit the graves—some out of curiosity, most out of a sense of appreciation for what American freedom has cost. For many families whose loved one's bodies were not identified, Arlington is the place where they focus their grief and look for healing.

Many across America have "lost" loved ones. No, they were not killed in action. They just left home, too often never to return. Contact is lost. Families do not know if the loved one is alive. Parents grieve these lost ones, but they do not have an Arlington Cemetery to focus their loss and grief.

We know, however, that these people are not lost to God. God keeps track and seeks to bring them to relationship with God and with family. Christian believers and their local congregations are one point through which God expresses this continuing love. Individuals and congregations need always to keep their eyes and hearts open to those wandering in or through their community. Each person is a son or daughter from a family, no matter how stretched that definition may become. And, each person is *known to God*. God allows us to be agents, partners in God's love. Maybe we can be the person through whom God rescues a lost and wandering soul.


#### **One Great Hour of Sharing**

Senad Talic and his wife, Mina, and their infant son, Jasmine, lived on a chicken farm in Kozarac, Bosnia. The Talics are Muslims. Without warning at 2 A.M. on May 26, 1992, Serbs arrived at the Talic home and herded them into the street. Senad was shoved onto a bus with about 120 other men. Bodies were stacked four and five high. In detention camps, Talic's liver and kidneys were severely bruised by beatings and torture. He wondered where his wife and child were or whether he'd ever see them again. Mina and Jasmine had also been bused to a detention camp. They were not beaten, but young girls—ages fourteen and fifteen—were raped and sometimes left for dead by Serbian soldiers. The Red Cross helped Talic find his family by spreading word throughout the refugee camps. When Mina and Jasmine were located, the family was reunited on December 14. Having survived separation and ruthless treatment in their homeland, the Talics wanted a new life in a new country.

The Bosnian Muslim Talic family found refuge in the United States on June 21, 1993. Their move was sponsored by the First Baptist Church of Oregon City, Oregon. The Talics were among 11,390 refugees resettled by the American Baptist Churches in conjunction with Church World Service from January 1, 1992, to June 30, 1993. The refugees fled from twenty-nine countries, including Burma, Haiti, Vietnam, Ethiopia, Ukraine, Cuba and Zaire. Approximately one-fifth of the refugees sponsored by the denomination are Baptist. The worldwide population of refugees and asylum seekers stood at 17,556,900 as of December 31, 1992.

Providing places of refuge for refugees, in the name of our Lord, is the mandate of the Immigration and Refugee Services of our denomination. This specialized ministry is supported by the One Great Hour of Sharing offering. It is through One Great Hour of Sharing that American Baptists provide emergency relief, refugee resettlement, and development assistance to people in need around the world and here at home.






To put into words all that I learned during my summer as a volunteer missionary at the Anadarko Christian Center is a difficult and emotional effort. To say that it was a life-changing experience is almost an understatement. The most important lesson God taught me is that God cannot be limited, for God is ultimately in control of everything. God crosses all social, cultural, racial, and ethnic boundaries to accomplish the purpose of furthering the kingdom.

The more time I spent with the center kids, the more the Lord developed in me a heart that sought to minister on a deeper level. The kids themselves taught me lessons about living and loving outside my own comfort zone. It is worth every minute that you spend trying to break down a wall and give of yourself so the kids can see that you are human too. I learned what unconditional love really means, how to give it, and how to receive it. Working at the center provided me with an opportunity to see the inside structure and backbone of ministry. I saw how the power of prayer can move mountains; I learned that I cannot put God in a box and limit the ways that God can call each one of us to respond to ministry.

The writer of these words, Valerie Woodruff, a young woman from Pennsylvania, has served as a National Ministries volunteer missionary at the Anadarko Christian Center on four separate occasions. Valerie's faith, put into action, exemplifies Psalm 150 as she seeks to follow the call to discipleship given to each one of us.

Evangelism is top priority in all the churches I have visited. The request is always the same: "We no longer want to be regarded as those to be witnessed to, but as those who witness. Help us!"






# Christmas Student Recognition Sunday
