"Wilt heden nu treden voor God den Heere, Hem boven al loven van herten seer, End' maken groot zijns lieven namens eere, Die daar nu onsen vijant slaat terneer."

These words form the first verse of a Dutch hymn reputed to have been sung after their army had been victorious and had secured their independence from a foreign power that had restricted their freedom to gather and worship in their own way. There was great meaning for those who came together to celebrate their new found liberty.

Don't be surprised if you can't make out the meaning of it, even if you happen to know a little of the Dutch language. Translators have a difficult time with it, especially finding English words that match the old Dutch Folk Melody to which it is sung.



The general gist of the song is captured in the popular hymn we know as, "We Gather Together."

"We gather together to ask the Lord's blessing; He chastens and hastens His will to make known. The wicked oppressing now cease from distressing. Sing praises to His Name; He forgets not His own."

For us it is a well-known Thanksgiving hymn (just for fun, see if you can match the Dutch words to the familiar tune.) Most of my life I never knew its context and meaning, other than gratitude, which is the sentiment of the month of November. And we *are* thankful, and will likely sing, "We Gather Together,"

some time this month, to worship God and sing praises to God's name.

November this year, will be for me, a month of vacation. I will be away on the 13th and the 20th. I know you will welcome Dwight Davidson on the 13th, and ABCUSA missionary Jeni Pedzinski on the 20th. I am thankful for the time away, and for being able to serve such a generous and loving congregation as ours.
